

ECO NEWS

This week, in an assembly, the children were told about a few campaigns we're getting involved in at school.

Firstly, we are starting to recycle batteries. The scheme 'Recycle to Read' gives the opportunity to win reading books for the school by collecting batteries. We will be collecting



AAA, AA, C, D, 9V batteries and button batteries. Lithium batteries need to have tape over their contacts. The children learnt the impact old batteries can have if they are sent to landfill, and the waste of resources if the metals are not recycled. Our collection point is in the main office,

under the screen. Please ask if you're unsure.

Our second campaign, aimed at reducing waste and raising money is Bag2School. This holidays might be a good opportunity to have a clear out of old clothes, soft toys, belts



and bags. If these can be put into bags and brought into school on SCHOOL Tuesday 30th April then it will be collected and weighed before

being reused. More information is in the attached letter.

Our last Eco-related fundraiser is an optional sponsored litter pick. So many children feel passionate about keeping our environment litter-free and Spring is a great time to get busy with cleaning up our environment. We'd love it if keen litter pickers were able to choose a local space to clear up. We thought it could be a good opportunity to fundraise towards the cost of coaches for Key Stage 2, who are visiting the Waste Recycling Centre in Waterbeach in May, by seeing if any children would like to be sponsored for their litter pick. It could be how long they litter pick for or for how many pieces/bags of litter collected. This is an optional activity. Please make sure children are supervised and safe when picking litter. (wearing gloves is ideal). A sponsorship form is attached with the newsletter.
