Healthy Eating!

Please find attached to the newsletter our new three weekly menu. You will notice we have reduced sweet puddings and increased the other options for the children. In Week 3 we have introduced Children's Choice on Wednesdays. In assembly this week Ms Noble and I explained to the children that this is their opportunity to suggest one of their favourite dishes for the school menu. Children need to write a persuasive letter to Ms Noble and put it in the box outside the kitchen; a suggestion will be chosen by Ms Noble and this will be put in the newsletter the week before. Year 6 have already written some excellent letters and they were able to tell the rest of the school that the letters need to be well presented and include reasons why the dish should be chosen e.g. health benefits. Dishes obviously need to be both practical and within a school budget! Do encourage your child to write to Ms Noble - this is a great opportunity for purposeful writing!

Along with trying to make our school lunches even healthier, we have reminded the children that break time snacks should not include any crisps or confectionary. Reception and KSI are provided with fruit or vegetables which is an ideal healthy snack. Birthdays!
